In reward, the King allowed him to bear the Royal emblem of a 12 pointed stag in his coat of arms. In honour of this award, the family recently added the Clan crest to each bottling of the Dalmore.

Island

- Highland Park** – 12 year old (Orkney) 40%
Soft, sweet, warming and smooth with faint peat and a long finish £3.55
- Isle of Jura** – 10 year old (Jura) 40%
Salty and sweet, hints of pepper, medium bodied and easy drinking £3.60
- Talisker** – 10 year old (Skye) 45.8%
Intense and smoky with smooth and mild peat notes £3.80
- Tobermory** – 10 year old (Mull) 46.3%
Cask strength, sweet and light with honey spice and soft oak notes £3.65

Kintyre

- Springbank** – 10 year old (Campbeltown) 46%
Smoke vanilla and spice with a salty tang from this unique distillery £3.80

Lowland

- Glenkinchie** – 12 year old (Pencaitland) 43%
The “Edinburgh Malt”, spicy nose, warming sherry palate and spicy vanilla finish £3.90

Highland

- Glenmorangie** – 10 year old (Tain) 40%
Spicy, grassy nose, flavours of buttered caramel, orange and peach, smooth and long £3.60
- Dalmore** – 12 year old (Alness) 40%
Fruity on the nose, orange, light sherry and ginger spice on the palate with malty notes £3.90
- Dalmore** – 18 year old (Alness) 43%
Matured for 14 years in American oak, then 4 years in Sherry cask. Stunning malt, complex fruity and spicy nose. Palate notes of chocolate raisins and juicy citrus fruits lead to a toffee apple prolonged finish £7.85
- Tomatin** – 18 year old (Tomatin) 46%
Spicy, subtle smoke on the nose leads to a sweet and smoky palette with notes of barley sugar and honeycomb £5.45

Speyside

Glenfiddich – 12 year old (Dufftown) 40%

Floral and fruity on the nose with a light smooth and spicy palate

The Glenlivet – 12 year old (Ballindalloch) 40%

Sweet vanilla and honeyed fruit on the nose and palate with a long apple and almond finish

Balvenie Caribbean Cask – 14 year old (Dufftown) 43%

Aged in Oak for 14 years then finished in Rum Casks. Creamy tropical nose leads to a sweet vanilla palate with notes of apple and mango

Islay

Bunnahabhain – 12 year old (Port Askaig) 46.3%

Cask strength, sweet, seaweed and malty nose with a soft nutty sweet and salty palate. Pronounced "Boon-ah-haven" – from the Gaelic meaning mouth of the river

Laphroaig – 10 year old (Port Ellen) 40%

Smoke and iodine rich, highly peated nose leads to complex salted, spicy and oaky palate, leading to a long dry finish

WHISKY LIQUEURS

Glavya

Scotch Whisky blended with honey, spices, almonds and tangerines (Edinburgh) 35% - from the Gaelic "Gle mhath" meaning very good, now trademarked as the "best liqueur in the World"

Drambuie

Scotch Whisky blended with honey, herbs and spices (Broxburn) 40% - from the Gaelic phrase "An dram buidheach" meaning "the drink that satisfies"
